"My story goes through six years of being diagnosed, researching treatments, selecting Brachytherapy, being treated and then watching the PSA regularly for two years, a biopsy at 2.5 years out, and watching since."

The theme "your business, my body" came about through the accepted recognition that medical people give their best advice. But they have their methods of treatment that they believe are best — but which are not always best for prostate cancer patients.

The cover depicts the maze of potential options encountered by any man diagnosed with prostate cancer.

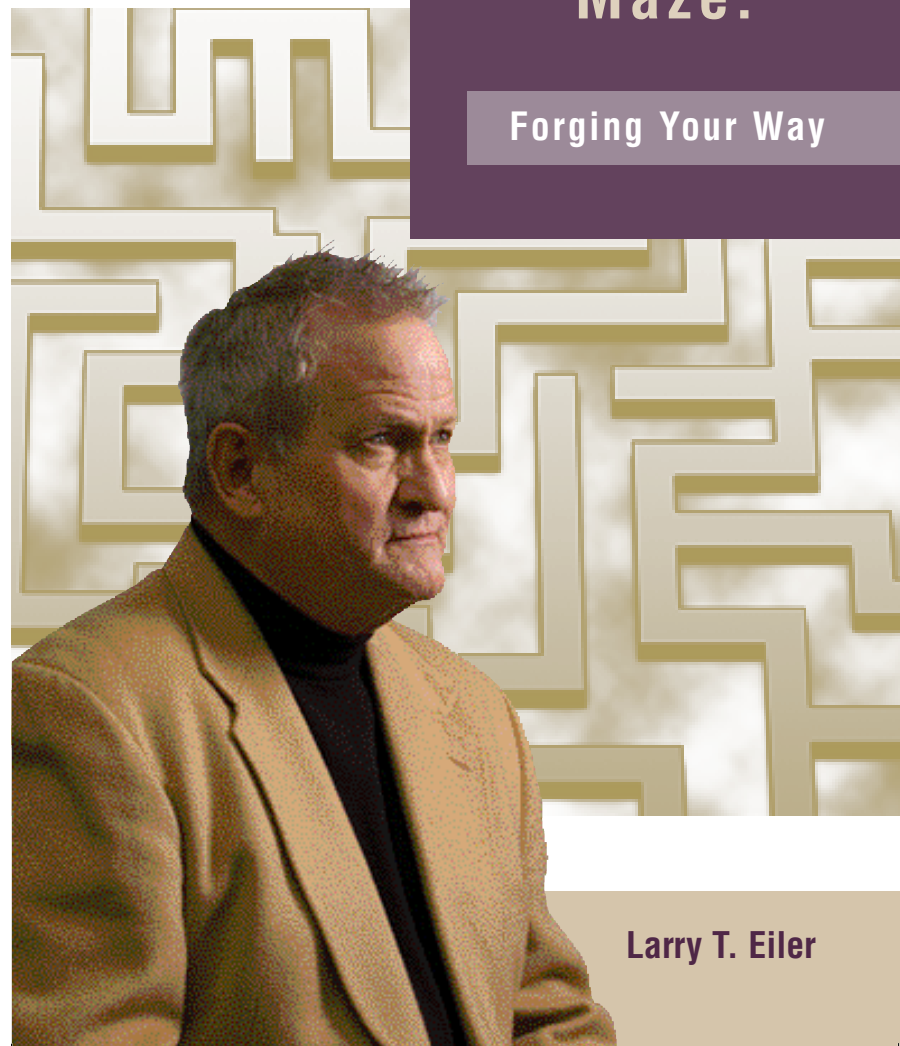
